Los Angeles has adopted the Green New Deal for the city. It aims to battle climate change, opting for clean renewal energy sources and economic opportunities.



What You Need to Know

- 1.** Impact Climate Change—we're looking at things like adding trees. Drive to the Westside, and you'll see trees everywhere in communities like Brentwood. Go to parts of the San Fernando Valley or South L.A. and northeast parts of the city, and there's almost nothing. LA County is bringing equity to trees throughout neighborhoods. We want to reduce the heat, improve the landscape and build the infrastructure of our communities.
 - 2.** Renewable energy sources—phasing out natural gas appliances and moving to all-electric homes? We're seeing cities that have started to embrace that for private and new construction.
 - 3.** Green Jobs—Part of a just transition is ensuring that workers from the fossil fuel economy still have jobs. The Green New Deal calls for the creation of 300,000 green jobs by 2035. We want to show L.A. is not only doing the right thing for the environment but workers.
