KAREN BALUMBU-BENNETT - PERINATAL POPULATION

- **TITLE:** WHEN THE 'HELPER' NEEDS HELP: PROVIDING PERINATAL SUPPORT, WHILE STRUGGLING WITH YOUR OWN FERTILITY CHALLENGES AND/OR PREGNANCY LOSS.
- **DESCRIPTION:** THIS PRESENTATION WILL EXPLORE THE CHALLENGES ASSOCIATED WITH SUPPORTING THE PERINATAL POPULATION WHEN THE PROVIDER/HELPER IS STRUGGLING WITH THEIR OWN INFERTILITY AND/OR PREGNANCY LOSS. ONE IN 6 COUPLES STRUGGLE WITH FERTILITY CHALLENGES AND PERINATAL AND MATERNAL HEALTH WORKERS ARE NOT EXEMPT. THIS PRESENTATION WILL EXPLORE THE UNIQUE CHALLENGES HELPING PROFESSIONALS FACE AND THE IMPLICATIONS ASSOCIATED WITH NOT RECEIVING ADEQUATE SUPPORT.

APRIL FOSTER - HOUSING AND REPRODUCTIVE JUSTICE

SONITA MOSS - CAREGIVING FOR DEMENTIA AND ALZHEIMER'S

- **TITLE:** BLACK WOMEN NEED CARE TOO: THE ESSENTIAL NEED TO EXPAND SUPPORT FOR CAREGIVERS
- DESCRIPTION: BLACK WOMEN IN THE U.S. DISPROPORTIONATELY FACE SIMULTANEOUS RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARENTING, WORKING, COMMUNAL LEADERSHIP AND NOW A RISING PHENOMENON: STEPPING IN AS A CAREGIVER FOR FAMILY MEMBERS FACING COGNITIVE ISSUES LIKE DEMENTIA AND ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE. BLACK WOMEN ARE MORE LIKELY TO BEAR THE CHALLENGES OF BEING A CAREGIVER. CAREGIVER STRESS IS A RISING THREAT, BUT IT CAN BE MITIGATED WITH ADDITIONAL SUPPORT FROM LOCAL PROGRAMS AND SERVICES. IMPORTANTLY, IT CAN BE MITIGATED THROUGH COMMUNAL SUPPORT. THIS TALK WILL DISCUSS THE RISE OF CAREGIVING AND THE SUPPORTIVE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES THAT EXIST TO SUPPORT BLACK WOMEN AND FEMMES WHO ARE AMIDST THEIR CAREGIVER JOURNEY.

FRANCINE COEYTAUX - PLAN C

- **TITLE:** SISTERS HELPING SISTERS MAILING ABORTION PILLS AND PROVIDING INFORMATION TO ALL WHO ASKS, IN ALL 50 STATES.
- **DESCRIPTION:** TALK WILL DESCRIBE THE AMAZING ABORTION ACCESS LANDSCAPE THAT LEADERS IN CA, INCLUDING BWW, HAVE MADE HAPPEN.

DIONA NICOLE MURRAY - REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND INFERTILITY

- **TITLE:** ROOTING OUT INEQUITY: REPRODUCTIVE JUSTICE AND THE UNTREATED EPIDEMIC AMONG BLACK WOMEN
- DESCRIPTION: THIS TALK ADDRESSES REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH INEQUITIES AFFECTING BLACK WOMEN, INCLUDING UNTREATED CONDITIONS LIKE ENDOMETRIOSIS, FIBROIDS, AND PCOS. DIONA NICOLE MURRAY, A WOMEN'S REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH RESEARCHER, EXAMINES HOW RACISM AND BIAS LEAD TO POOR QUALITY OF LIFE AND HIGHER INFERTILITY RATES. SHE HIGHLIGHTS THE ISSUES OF NORMALIZING EXCESSIVE MENSTRUAL BLEEDING, DISMISSING BLACK WOMEN'S HEALTH CONCERNS, AND RELYING ON QUICK FIXES LIKE BIRTH CONTROL AND HYSTERECTOMIES. MURRAY ADVOCATES FOR EDUCATION, SUPPORT, AND ADVOCACY, EMPHASIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF AUTHENTIC BLACK VOICES AND PRESENTING HER NON-PROFIT, BARREN FRUIT, AS A MODEL FOR EQUITABLE REPRODUCTIVE HEALTHCARE ACCESS.

DESIGNING OUR FUTURE: PERSPECTIVES AND VISIONS FOR A NEW ERA OF JUSTICE AND LIBERATION



Dázon Dixon Diallo is a recognized visionary and advocate in the struggle for human rights through sexual and reproductive health, rights and justice, and the fight against HIV, STIs and Gender-based Violence. Dázon is Founder and President of SisterLove, Inc, established in 1989, the first Sexual and Reproductive Justice organization focused on women and HIV in the southeastern United States. She is a proud member of In Our Own Voice: National Black Women's Reproductive Justice Agenda Partnership, where she advocates for sexual and reproductive health, rights and justice in public health and prevention policies and programs. Dr. Diallo is a co-chair for the Act Now End AIDS National Coalition. She has achieved a deep reach with a diverse community of listeners for 30 years, as producer and host of a weekly radio program focused on black women, called "Sisters' Time/WomenSpeak" on WRFG 89.3FM in Atlanta and wrfg.org. Dr. Diallo holds a master's degree in public health from the University of Alabama at Birmingham (C'97) and bachelor's degree from Spelman College (C'86) in Atlanta. In 2012, Dr. Diallo had the distinct honor to receive an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from her alma mater, Spelman College.

Diallo has blazed many trails with her compassionate leadership, and unique sense of humor and empathy. In 1999, Diallo opened SisterLove International South Africa (SLISA) in Johannesburg where they currently implement national capacity building and promote community engagement for human rights and reproductive justice advocacy, and high impact combination prevention of HIV and Gender-based Violence in adolescent girls and young women. As an "Ideas Maven", Diallo is a consummate innovator, inspiring leader and visionary thinker. She has been recognized and honored, and has received numerous awards over the 40 years she has been working in health justice, women's liberation and human rights.


ADIA "JA'NEA" JAMES HEALTH LITERACY EDUCATION AS A MODALITY TO REPRODUCTIVE AUTONOMY



ABOUT BLACK WOMEN FOR WELLNESS

Black Women for Wellness (BWW) began in 1994 as a grassroots initiative with six women dedicated to the health and well-being of Black babies. Partnering with the Birthing Project, they launched the Shangazi Program, which paired pregnant women with "sisterfriends" mentors who guided them through pregnancy and the first year of their child's life. This mentorship aimed to provide crucial support systems to combat infant and maternal mortality rates. In 1997, BWW transitioned into a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization in California, expanding its focus to address systemic and political policies affecting Black women's health.

By 2017, BWW had become a cornerstone community institution in Los Angeles County, home to over one million Southern Californians, including the largest African American population in the region. BWW also serves Stockton and the San Joaquin Valley in Northern California. The organization addresses significant health disparities, such as obesity and lack of health insurance, particularly in SPA 6, where women of color are disproportionately affected. Through various programs, BWW supports youth, young adults, adults, and seniors, promoting a vision of empowered Black women and girls leading healthy lives and communities. Believing in the strength and wisdom of their community, BWW focuses on harnessing collective power and resources to create meaningful change and improve health outcomes.
